

COOKIE POLICY

How cookies and other similar technologies are used on our websites

Cookies are small text files sent to your computer when you visit our websites. We use cookies for the aforementioned purposes and in accordance with this Privacy Policy.

We do not use cookies to track individual visitors or to identify them, but rather to obtain useful information on how our visitors use our websites, so that we can continue to improve them for our users. The personal data generated by cookies are collected through pseudonymization and you have the right to object to the processing of such data, as indicated below.

We use cookies on this website in order to:

- address you toward the pertinent sections of the website;
- guarantee that the website has a consistent aspect in the different browsers and devices;
- enable the operation of complex areas of the website
- keep track of anonymous and aggregated statistical data, related to the visits to the website to improve the performance.

To such purpose, we could install cookie that collect data such as the user's domain name, the internet service provider, the operating system and the date and the schedule of access.

In the following there are explained the general typologies of cookies that we use and their purposes.

Types of cookies and their purposes

- first-party cookies: cookies installed by the website that the user visits (the website visualized in the URL window);
- session cookies: cookies that expires at the end of the browser session (they start at the time the user opens the browser's window and they end when the user leaves the browser);
- persistent cookies: cookies that persist in the device after the end of the browser session and therefore they allow us to store preferences or actions of the user for his following visit to the website.

Most of web's browsers allow to control most of the cookies through browser's settings. The user can set the browser in order to obtain a notification whenever it receives a cookie; so he can decide whether to accept or not the cookie. However, if the user doesn't accept a cookie, he may not be able to use all the functionalities of his browser's software.

In this website we could use internet tag (also known as web-beacons, action tags, single-pixel GIF, transparent GIF, invisible GIF, and 1by1 GIF) and cookies and we may do this by means of a web analytics service partner based and storing their information (including your IP address) in a foreign country. These tags/cookies are situated on different pages of this website. We use this technology to measure the answer of the user to our sites (including how many times a page is opened and what information are consulted), as well as to evaluate the use of this Website.

Our third-party partners, hosting service provider and/or web analytics service partner, could collect data regarding your use of this Website under these Internet tags/anonymized cookies and they could compile reports for us regarding the activity of this website and to provide additional services related to the use of the Website and the internet. They could provide such information to other parties, if this is required by law or if they use other parties to process the data on their behalf.

This website uses Google Analytics, a web analysis service provided by Google Inc. ("Google"). Google Analytics uses so-called "cookies" (text files stored on your computer), that allow him to analyze the use made of the website. The information, produced by the cookie regarding your use of this website, is generally transmitted to a service of Google in the United States and stored there. If the IP anonymization procedure is activated on this website, your IP address will be shortened by Google in a UE Member State or in any other State that has undersigned the Agreement on the European Economic Area. Only in exceptional cases, the full IP address will be transferred to a Google server in the United States and shortened there. If this information are transferred by the

operator of this website, Google will use it to evaluate your use of the website, in order to compile report on website activity for the operators and to provide further services associated to the use of the website and internet. The IP address transmitted in the Google Analytics model by your browser won't be associated with other data by Google. You may block the installation of cookies by properly setting your browser software; however, we would like to point out that, in this case, you may not be able to fully use all the functions of this Website.

Google AdWords & Google Remarketing Cookies

This website could use the Google AdWords and Google Remarketing technology. Both are managed by Google Inc. The AdWords conversion-tracking feature also uses cookies. To help us track sales and other conversions, a cookie is added to a user's computer when that user clicks on an ad.

This cookie lasts 30 days and does not collect or monitor information that can personally identify a user. Users can disable Google conversion tracking cookies in their internet browser settings.

In some cases, cookies can cause problems when accessing or while browsing your Adwords account.

When this occurs, the best way to correct the problem is to clear the cache and delete saved cookies for your internet browser. To learn more about it click here <https://www.google.es/intl/it/policies/privacy/>.

Finally, we could also use the following typologies of common cookies:

- cookies used to customize the user interface (i.e. cookies to store preferences);
- authentication cookies (i.e. cookies that allows you to leave and return to our sites without having to repeat the authentication);
- cookies used for audio/video content (i.e. cookie that store the data needed to play back an audio or review a video and your preferences again);
- cookies used for profiling, aimed at creating user profiles that are normally used in order to send advertising messages in line with the preferences shown by the user in the context of web browsing;
- on this site technical and profiling cookie are used, in order to guarantee the correct use of the site contents and to allow browsing. In particular, the site uses the cookies of the following authors: Google Inc. (Analytics, ADWORDS, Remarketing, YouTube), Facebook Inc. the use of cookies is in compliance with the applicable rules and, in particular, with the EU Regulation 2016/679 without prejudice to the possible liability of the authors of the same.

How to disable cookies

The website you visit allows you to select/deselect individual cookies, in the manner described below, but it should be noted that, in the event of deactivation, the full usability of the same may not be guaranteed.

Firefox

1. Open Firefox
2. Press the *Alt* button on the keyboard
3. In the toolbar located at the top of the browser, select *Tools* and then *Options*
4. Then select the *Privacy* tab
5. Go to *Setting History* and then to *Use Custom Settings*. Uncheck *Accept* cookies from site and save preferences.

Internet Explorer

1. Open Internet Explorer
2. Click on the *Tools* button and then on *Internet Options*

3. Select the *Privacy* tab and move the slider to the level of privacy you wish to set (upwards to block all cookies or downwards to allow them all)
4. Then click *ok*.

Google Chrome

1. Open *Google Chrome*
2. Click on *Tools* icon
3. Select *Settings* and then *Advanced* settings
4. Select *Content* settings under *Privacy*
5. In the *Cookies* tab you can deselect the cookies and save the preferences

Safari

1. Open *Safari*
2. Choose *Preferences* in the toolbar, then select the *Security* panel in the dialog bog that follows
3. In the *Accept cookies* section you can specify if and when Safari must save cookies from websites. For more information click on the *Help* button
4. For more information about the cookies that are stored on your computer, click on *Show cookies*.

Deactivation functions currently available for the Google Analytics Web

To offer to the website visitors the possibility of preventing Google Analytics from using their data, the browser add-on has been developed that deactivates the Google Analytics JavaScript code (ga.js, analytics.js, dc.js). If you wish to deactivate Google Analytics, download and install the add-on for your web browser. The add-on that deactivates Google analytics is compatible with Chrome, Internet Explorer 11, Safari, Firefox and Opera. To work, it must be loaded and executed correctly in the browser in use. For internet explorer it is necessary to activate third-party cookies.
